

#### Into The Wilderness of Lent: A Spiritual Awakening

"Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. <sup>2</sup> He fasted forty days and forty nights, and afterwards he was famished. <sup>3</sup> The tempter came and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command these stones to become loaves of bread." <sup>4</sup> But he answered, "It is written, 'One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God."

Matthew 4:1-4

Epiphany has come and gone like a warm day in Kansas winter. We are at the beginning of our Lenten journey. Every year when we embark on these solemn forty days, we set aside these days to reflect on the love Jesus gave us with His ultimate sacrifice by fasting and giving something up. We see this in the book of Matthew and Luke, where Jesus is swept up in a gust of wind and thrown into the wilderness where he is tempted and he fasted for forty days. In those forty nights and days, Jesus had to overcome and prevail against all the evil forces and remain steeped within God's mission and His purpose. Thus, each step into lent is a step into deep reflection, preparation, solemn observation, and prayer.

While Lent is usually a period where we give something up, we have given up so much these past two years. We have given up gathering opportunities, birthdays, vacations, and the list goes on. So, this year I challenge you to incorporate something into your spiritual life. I want you to ask the question, what is giving you energy? What is feeding your soul? And what is something you want to incorporate into your spiritual journey? As you answer these questions, take a pause, and look around. Look at what you have and what you need to strengthen and continue your spiritual life. This Lenten season I will not only be incorporating Reformations daily devotional but will be doing a personal bible study called SOAP:

Scripture: pick a chapter or a few verses in a biblical book of your choosing.

Observation: what stands out, what words or stories captivate you

Application: how does this apply to your life or your day

Prayer: end with a prayer

I will be reading the book of Exodus, and in each chapter, I will explore the sacred text in how it applies to me, my life, and its teachings. I challenge you to add new tools to your spiritual toolbox. Rather, it is carving out moments of peace during the day, incorporating self-care once a week, reading your bible daily, or practicing positive affirmations. I urge you to see how God works throughout your spiritual life this Lenten season and how you can grow, shape, and add.

What are you bringing into your Lenten journey?

#### Fun Facts about Reformation Lutheran Church:

- In 1989 the senior high youth attended the Lutheran Youth Encounter in Denver and went on a ski trip.
