As 1 Thessalonians 5:18 says, "Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." True thanksgiving notices God's presence, even when life feels heavy, and helps us see the ordinary moments that are quietly filled with grace.

That perspective can transform the way we experience the world. It's in a child's laugh, the soft morning light streaming through a window, the chatter around a table that has held generations of love. Every blessing, big or small, is a gift from God, shaping our faith and giving us hope.

As I think about the week ahead family, home, and tradition I'm reminded that thanksgiving isn't just about food or festivities. It's about noticing God's abundant grace in every corner of our lives. It's about being fully present with the people who matter most and letting gratitude shape how we see the world. Even when life feels uncertain, we are held, loved, and blessed.

Psalm 107:1 reminds us, "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever." Gratitude is a way of seeing and acknowledging that enduring love, even when life doesn't go as planned. It invites us to notice ordinary moments as sacred, fleeting joys as signs of God's presence.

This Thanksgiving, I encourage you to look for those gifts around you the warmth of family, the comfort of friends, the quiet moments that carry grace in unexpected ways. I'm heading home filled with gratitude for my family, for tradition, and for God's sustaining presence in my life.

May your Thanksgiving be rich with blessings, overflowing with grace, and filled with the reminder that God's love endures forever. It is seen in laughter, reflection, warm meals, and hearts full of thanks.

We will once again be hosting the VA Last Roll Call on November 15th. This is a VA event, they do all the prep and onsite work (except the sound system) and we are a convenient facility for them to be able to host this wonderful tribute to our Vets.

Financial Snapshot:

Our expenses continue to be managed well and are being kept as close to our budget as possible, however we have now eased over our budgeted expenses by \$2,543. While we have seen strong giving over the year, we have dipped slightly behind last year, and continue to fall behind our conservatively developed budget, we are now at a deficit of \$22,225. Fortunately, we have been able made things work within the financial parameters that are established but could use some extra influx of funds to make sure we can properly take care of the wonderful resources we have. Although September saw a strong giving month to start this last quarter of the year we ask members to prayerfully consider their financial support as we continue to carry out the mission of Reformation Lutheran Church.
