In Lent there is Love

"In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world."

John 16:33

This year, we celebrate Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day on the same day. Valentine's Day is a reminder of the power of love in our lives, whether it's with a partner, friends, or family. 1 Corinthians 13:4-8 beautifully captures the essence of love, and we can draw parallels between these qualities and the period of self-reflection and spiritual preparation that Lent represents.

Lent invites us to examine our hearts, practice humility, and cultivate a deeper understanding of love in its purest form. In the spirit of reflection, we turn to the words of 1 Corinthians 13:4-8, "Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy; it does not boast; it is not proud; it does not dishonor others; it is not self-seeking; it is not easily angered; it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. As we delve into the season of Lent, a period of selfreflection and spiritual preparation, we can draw parallels with the qualities outlined in 1 Corinthians. Lent invites us to examine our hearts, practice humility, and cultivate a deeper understanding of love in its purest form.

In Let Me Be a Woman, missionary Elisabeth Elliot writes about the "ground rules" for "how this thing called love really works - in a marriage, in the world." Her list reflects many of the principles found in 1 Corinthians 13, the Bible's love chapter.

- This love of which I speak is slow to lose patience. It looks for a way of being constructive.
- Love is not possessive.
- Love is not anxious to impress, nor does it cherish inflated ideas of its own ideas.
- Love has good manners and does not pursue selfish advantage.
- Love is not touchy.
- Love does not keep account of evil or gloat over the wickedness of other people. On the contrary, it is glad ... when truth prevails.
- Love knows no limits to its endurance, no end to its trust, no fading of its hope; it can outlast anything. It is, in fact, the one thing that stands when all else has fallen.

Let us strive to be patient and kind, to cast aside envy and pride, and to focus on the uplifting aspects of love. Lent provides us with an opportunity to shed the burdens that may weigh us down, fostering a spirit of renewal and growth. As we navigate the intertwining themes of Valentine's Day, Lent, and the profound teachings of 1 Corinthians 13:4-8, let us use this season to uplift one another and practice love that protects, trusts, hopes, and perseveres.

January Council Recap

Hayenga fund: In 2023, Reformation received a \$278,000 gift from the family of Betty Hayenga. A committee has been established to determine the next steps for overseeing this generous gift. To date the funds have been invested in an interest bearing CD and Money Market account. In January the council decided that due to the size and expected longevity of this fund that it would be in our best interest to identify these funds in a dedicated account within the Reformation accounting system.

Budget: David Dorf, treasurer, presented the council with a Final Draft of the 2024 budget. Council accepted and approved the 2024 budget as presented.

Highlights to be aware of: Income lower than prior years but based upon the current giving trend. Admin Expenses lower than prior years mainly due to new copier contract. Salaries and Compensation slightly increase, approved educational assistance plan in December 2023 was reflected. Small increases in Fellowship and Worship board funds. Reductions in Learning, Outreach/Inreach, and Service Board funds. Property board funds lower but on track with actual expenditures.

Summer Worship:

Plans are to proceed with a single service during the summer months. The structure for this service is still in the planning stages. Time for the service still to be determined but anticipate it to be somewhere in between the current service times.




